DADE HERITAGE TRUST ACTIVITIES / BENEFITS

Advocacy

Dade Heritage Trust advocates for our community's historic sites and neighborhoods on a local, state and national level. DHT appears before preservation boards and commissions, and works with the media and community leaders. DHT's "Ten Most Endangered Historic Sites List" focuses much public attention on threatened historic resources.

Preservation of the Office of Dr. James M. Jackson

Built in 1905 as an office and surgery for the pioneer Doctor Jackson, this wood frame structure was moved to its present location just off Brickell Avenue in 1917. Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, it was restored by Dade Heritage Trust in 1976 and is maintained by the organization as its headquarters.

Preserving Historic Places

DHT spearheads efforts to save and restore Miami's historic landmarks. Successes include the restoration and re-lighting of the 1825 **Cape Florida Lighthouse on Key Biscayne**, saving the 2000-year-old **Miami Circle** from being bulldozed for a high-rise, rescuing the **Miami City Cemetery** from vandalism and neglect, preserving Miami-Dade's oldest house, the 1858 **Wagner Homestead in Lummus Park**, saving from destruction **Old Miami High**, relocating it to Southside Park for restoration, and saving the 1917 **Dice House**, the oldest house in Kendall, by relocating it to Continental Park for restoration as a community meeting facility.

Neighborhood Revitalization

DHT works with homeowners to protect and improve historic neighborhoods. DHT purchased a beautiful 1920s **Belvedere Bungalow in Little Havana** to save it from demolition and plans to restore it as a demonstration project.

Dade Heritage Days

Since 1983, Dade Heritage Trust has sponsored this springtime celebration showcasing our region's architectural, cultural and environmental resources. Lectures, tours, neighborhood open house, bicycles trips, archeological digs, folk life festivals, boat cruises, social events and commemorative services seek to unite our multi-ethnic, geographically diverse community through a shared appreciation of the area's heritage.

Educational Outreach

DHT's Heritage Tours offer a fascinating look at Miami's rich history and culture.

DHT publications include a newsletter, *Preservation Today* magazine, the beautiful book *Miami's Historic Neighborhoods*, and *History through Architecture: Preservation Activity Book*. A Preservation Library is maintained at DHT Headquarters, and a Speaker's Bureau gives presentations to school children and community groups.

Preservation Awards

Presented annually since 1972, DHT's Preservation Awards acknowledge exceptional individuals and groups for restoration projects, preservation service and financial support.
