Miami Urban Tree Trekkers, or MUTTS, is a multidisciplinary 4-12 program designed to educate students about the benefits of urban forests in South Florida. Led by DHT educators, the program begins with a classroom visit followed by school group visits to three different urban forests throughout the school year: Simpson Park Hammock, AD “Doug” Barnes Park, and Virginia Key Beach North Point Park. It is our hope that students will become advocates for environmental preservation.
