

The original house, a one-story compact house, is retained, however altered. The original structure retains the roofline detail, triangular pediment entry overhang, and decorative metal supports. The original carport has been enclosed the and Louvre doors replaced with modern glass doors and windows. A large two-story addition connects to the east side of the original house. While elements of the original home are retained, the oversized addition and the loss of original material result in a highly-altered house that no longer reads like the original.



The theater building at 3500 Main Highway was altered by Browning Parker in 1955, converting the former movie theater into a playhouse. The alterations were primarily focused on interior spaces, however on the exterior Browning Parker removed the decorative parapet wall and infilled the storefronts. While abandoned, the interiors have been damaged, and recent renovation work aims to replace the decorative parapets and storefronts, thus eliminating any traces of the Browning Parker alterations.

The house at 3187 Royal Road has been altered from its original appearance, however retains such character-defining features as the stone cladding, carport, multi-level plan, clerestory windows, and rooftop deck. The house, designed for Parker's own residence and highlighted as the first *Pace Setter* houses in *House Beautiful* in 1954. The house at 3187 Royal Road is considered one of Alfred Browning Parker's masterworks and an early watershed in his career.¹ Therefore, despite alterations the building is still considered contributing to the proposed district.

The house at 3645 Main Highway is now located within the Carrollton School's Duchesne Campus. The buildings are not visible from the public right-of-way, however based on aerial images, the original residence and library addition done by Alfred Browning Parker appear to be intact and retain their original site plan and massing.²





Parker considered the Hopwood's his first professional clients, and this house is one of his earliest works.⁵ Additionally, Parker built the house himself for the clients.

The house at 4149 Bonita Avenue was designed by Parker, however was built by the client without supervision and the plans were not faithfully followed.⁶ While the building has been further altered, some original features that likely reflect Parker's original design include vertical wood siding, clerestory windows, and site plan. While the trio of Marsh-Hopwood-Chandler residences are a significant grouping of early Alfred Browning Parker designs, the alterations to and not-faithful execution of the Marsh Residence makes it likely non-contributing to the proposed district.

The George Washington Carver Elementary School was originally designed by Parker in 1949 and featured a rectangular-plan building that housed classrooms and a parabolic-arched concrete gymnasium. The site has been highly altered over the years, with additional buildings connected to the original classroom block and the demolition of the original gymnasium. However, the original classroom building retains the deeply overhanging eaves and low, massing.

The house at 200 Grant Drive was built circa 1952 per property records. The front gable house has an integrated carport and decorative gable vent popular on many vernacular houses at the time. The house retains its original windows, however a stone veneer has been applied to the lower half of the front facade.

The house at 4156 Crawford Avenue was designed by Parker in 1948 and built between 1948 and 1954. The design was one of his earlier works and is set on a double corner lot with mature landscaping. The house, designed for newspaper editor Luther Votlz and his food journalist and expert wife, Jeanne.⁷ While the house is difficult to see from the road, the clerestory windows, exposed rafters, and butterfly roof are visible, indicating the house likely has retained a high degree of integrity.


The studio addition at 4395 Ingraham Highway was designed by Parker in 1949. In contrast to the traditional Mediterranean Revival-style house which has a cross-gable roof with no overhang and stone-clad walls, the Parker addition has a shed roof, with deeply overhanging eaves, exposed rafter tails, and simple stucco-clad walls. The addition reflects the modern design aesthetic of Parker, while blending with the original house.

The house that was located at 3701 El Prado Boulevard was demolished in 2020. Prior to demolition, the house retained a high degree of integrity including the recessed base clad in decorative concrete block, vertical wood siding on the second floor, low-pitched roof with deeply overhanging eaves, ribbon windows, and site plan. The building was considered contributing prior to demolition.
